


Figure 1. The Official Bell Centennial Logo

Cachet By: Unknown

Description: This blue cachet shows Bell's portrait in an oval frame surrounded by various models of telephones. The years 1847and 1947 are above the portrait and "CENTENNIAL" is at the bottom, together with Bell's signature.

Description: This cachet has the same design as the previous one, however it is printed in a much deeper shade of blue.



Cachet By: Cachet Craft (Ken Boll)


Description: Here is a brown cachet featuring a telephone within a circular frame and a portrait of Bell in a rectangular frame beside a maple leaf. Bell's name and the centennial years are at the top of the design, the place is identified in the maple leaf, and "FIRST DAY OF ISSUE" is the text in a brown rectangle at the bottom. This was the first cachet designed by Ken Boll for a Canadian stamp issue.

Cachet By: Stephen Anderson

Description: This maroon-coloured cachet was prepared for U.S. Scott No. 893 but used also for the Canadian Bell commemorative. The pictorial element shows the first telephone, as noted in the text beneath it, while below that appears Bell's name followed by a brief seven-line biography in very small type.



Description: This cachet has the identical design to the previous one but is in


black.



Cachet By: Aristocrats

Description: This cachet in black and grey also appears to have been prepared for the U. S. Scott No. 893 issue. It is one of a "FAMOUS AMERICAN INVENTORS" series as shown at the top and bottom of the design which features a picture of the first telephone. Bell's name and centenary years appear on a tablet near the top of the design while the text "PATENTED/ THE FIRST TELEPHONE/ 1876" appears directly above it.

Description: This simple design features a telephone at centre left and text across the bottom of the cover reading, "100th Anniversary Graham Bell—First Day Cover."









Description: This purple cachet includes the return address of the maker, a sketch of a telephone, and the following text: "100th Anniversary/ Alexander Graham Bell/ Inventor of the Telephone/ FIRST DAY COVER/ (SEE INSIDE)."

Description: Here is a hand-painted cachet showing an animated old-time telephone along with the wires strung between two poles.




Cachet By: City of Brantford

Description: This is the basic City of Brantford all-over cachet with the City's seal but no other sponsor's name appearing in the clouds above that. There is no label on the reverse and the invention of the telephone is given as 1873.



Cachet By: City of Brantford

Description: This version of the basic City of Brantford cachet has no label on the reverse side, and the date of the telephone's invention is given as 1874.



Cachet By: City of Brantford

Description: This basic Brantford cachet has a cut-and-pasted portrait of Bell on the front in place of the City's coat of arms.

Description: This version of the City cachet was sponsored by A. G. Spalding &

Additional text reads, "Commemorating the One Hundredth Anniversary of the Birth/ of Alexander Graham Bell, March 3rd, 1947." Note that the top line of text is longer than the bottom line. The cover is a larger size, 102 x 190 mm, than the next one.

Cachet By: William H. Talbot


Description: This cachet is identical with the previous one except that the two lines of text are equal in length and the envelope is smaller.


Description: A blue card was presented by the Kiwanis Club as a souvenir of the Bell commemorative. The card was franked with the Bell stamp and postmarked Edmonton. The text reads as follows: The Board of Directors of/ The Kiwanis Club of Edmonton/ Are Please to Present You With/ This Stamp/ in Commemoration of the/ Alexander Graham Bell/ Centennial Anniversary/ March 31st./ 1847—1947."


