


Figure 1. The Official Bell Centennial Logo

Cachet By: Teaneck Stamp Club


Description: This general purpose cachet was used by the Teaneck Stamp Club for several different issues of the period. At the left of the cover is vertical printing reading "The COLLECTORS' CLUB/ of BERGEN COUNTY" while the address of the Club is shown horizontally at top left.



Cachet By: New Westminster Stamp & Model Supply

Description: This is a very simple, generic cachet showing just the legend, "First

Day of Issue" in script.



Cachet By: Unknown

Description: This general purpose cachet has brown printed wording, "FIRST DAY OF ISSUE" with a star beneath it.



Cachet By: Unknown

Description: This is a red general purpose cachet featuring the Canadian Coat of Arms, with the only text being "FIRST DAY COVER" at the bottom.


Description: This general purpose cachet featuring the words, "GOOD NEIGHBOURS," an American flag and a Union Jack, a maple leaf, and three stars was printed on a #10 envelope.


Cachet By: L. E.

Description: This green general purpose cachet is a rather unusual trilingual product including English ("FIRST DAY OF ISSUE"), French ("LE PREMIER JOUR D'USAGE"), and Latin ("USQUE AD MARE"). The pictorial element of the cachet shows Canada's shield which is included in the lower centre portion of the Canadian Coat of Arms.


Description: This black cachet was first prepared for the Peace Issue of 1946 but was converted to a general purpose cachet by blacking out the original text. The design features a map of North America with the Society's name at the top and "First Day Cover" at the bottom in white lettering on black rectangles.



Cachet By: Winnipeg Philatelic Society

Description: This blue cachet was the standard design used by the Society for its FDC's. It shows a buffalo within a triangle whose border contains the Society's name. There is a banner beneath the triangle containing the legend "FIRST DAY COVER", and the date of the issue is shown at the bottom.

Description: This simple design in green and purple features a shield enclosing

the legend "FIRST DAY COVER."



Cachet By: E. L. F.

Description: This black cachet shows the Canadian Coat of Arms with lettering in italics. Above the Coat of Arms is "First Day of Issue," while below it is "Canadian/Postage Stamps."


Description: This cachet is the standard blue rubber-stamped design used by the Ottawa Philatelic Society on many stamp issues of the era. It features a maple leaf inside a double circle with a pedestal at the bottom which contained the date of the issue and the signature of the Society Secretary.

Description: This black, general purpose cachet has "CANADA" displayed in white letters against a black background in an arch at the top of the design, with "FIRST DAY OF ISSUE" below the arch and "POSTES POSTAGE" at either side.



Description: This general purpose cachet with unknown colours has an upper left border of stars, with an airplane in the corner, and a scalloped frame around the legend FIRST DAY ISSUE CANADA." "SPECIAL OCCASION" appears near the top slightly to the right of centre.

Description: This multi-coloured, general purpose cachet shows the Canadian Coat of Arms with "CANADA" printed beneath it. A horizontal line is near the bottom of the cover, with "POSTED ON DAY OF ISSUE" below it. There is a union-made symbol in the bottom right corner of the envelope.

Description: This is a purple edition of Rickson's typical cachet featuring a

frame and the words, "FIRST DAY COVER."


Description: This red version of Rickson's cachet has a slightly more elaborate design at the top of the frame, otherwise it is the same as the previous cachet although the colour is different.

Description: The frame on this cachet is the same as the previous one except that it is blue, however, there is a small portrait of Bell within the frame.



Cachet By: Mitchell

Description: This brown cachet shows a map of Canada with the legend "FIRST

DAY COVER" beneath it.



Cachet By: Wascana Stamp Club

Description: This is a general purpose cover used by the Club for a number of different FDC's. It features a pair of Union Jacks flanking a lion in a circular frame. The Club name forms an arch above the circle and "CANADA" is in a banner below it. Printed lettering "FiRST Day COVER" has been added.



Cachet By: Rosecraft

Description: This general purpose cachet shows the Peace Tower with a shield-like frame surrounding it and shields of ten provinces outside the frame. The first day of issue is noted in English and French at the top of the shield. This cover is illustrative of the fact that FDC's are not immune from those who would insinuate fanciful items into philately: It bears a Rosecraft cachet that was first printed in several different colour variations in 1962, some 15 years after the Bell issue. It appears that the cachet design was cut from a Rosecraft general purpose cachet and pasted to an original FDC.



Cachet By: Unknown

Description: This patriotic cachet in red and blue features a bulldog, three Union Jacks, and miscellaneous war equipment. The cover appears to have been a remnant from World War II which ended less than two years before the Bell commemorative was issued.



Cachet By: Jacques Minkus

Description: This is the first in a series of five cachets with patriotic themes by Jacques Minkus that were printed in 1942. This one features the Statue of Liberty, three fighter planes, and an eagle along with a V for Victory and the slogan, "ON./ TO VICTORY/ FOR LIBERTY."



Cachet By: Jacques Minkus

Description: The second Minkus cachet shows an extended torch and flame, with red, yellow, and blue colouring. A banner near the bottom of the cachet encloses the words, "KEEP THAT LIGHT BURNING."



Cachet By: Jacques Minkus

Description: This cachet shows an eagle clutching a Hitler-like figure which is

clinging to a globe. The text reads "NOT SO FAST/ ADOLF!"



Cachet By: Jacques Minkus

Description: This rather gruesome cachet shows the heads of three "enemy" figures, with the slogan "STAMP 'EM OUT!" printed above them.


Description: The fifth Minkus cachet in this series shows an eagle standing on a globe. A banner above the eagle has the slogan, "UNITED FOR FREEDION AND EQUALITY."

Description: This patriotic cachet features a large V with a torch burning within and the text "United for VICTORY: at the bottom. Outlines of soldiers appear on either side of the V.




Cachet By: Unknown

On/ Canada [in script]." It was first used in 1942 for the War Issue.

Description: This cachet shows the American flag with the country name above


it and "THE FLAG/ WE LOVE" below.

Description: Here is another cachet of U.S. origin showing the American flag,


the legend "First Day/ of Issue", and Krysty's home address.



Description: This general purpose cachet has a very plain "First Day Cover"


notation printed in the upper left corner.


Description: This personal-use, colourful Air Mail cover is addressed to Czechoslovakia and has a "First day of use" notation in the upper left corner.
